2020 SCHOLARSHIP AWARD REGULATIONS

Amount of Award

SKCR/First Citizen Scholarship Foundation (SFCSF) Board of Directors may award up to \$5,000 per year, per recipient, for tuition, fees, books, and/or room and board. Except as may be determined by the SFCSF Board of Directors in exceptional cases, the award shall be paid in a lump sum directly to the university, college, school or educational program selected by the recipient, within two years of granting of such award.

Eligibility

Applications are open to REALTOR® and Affiliate members of Seattle King County REALTORS (SKCR) in good standing. i.e. continuous and paid membership for a minimum of one year preceding the application deadline of **May 1, 2020**. Also eligible are the children, foster-children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews of SKCR members in good standing.

In addition, all applicants must:

1. Be high school graduates or in some other manner establish eligibility for the course of study or training to be pursued;
2. Meet admission requirements of the university, college, school or educational program selected;
3. Follow a program that leads to a degree, certification, or professionally recognized program for self-improvement. For SKCR member applicants, the program must be real estate related;
4. Manifest qualities of character, loyalty, good citizenship, academic achievement, leadership and self-reliance and exhibit exemplary standards of personal conduct;
5. Be willing to submit to a personal interview if requested by the SFCSF Board of Directors.

NOTE: Effective 2014, applicants may receive a maximum of two SFCSF scholarship awards.

The completed application and all supporting data must be received by May 1, 2020 and shall include items 1-5 listed below. If any item is missing, it will automatically disqualify the application from further consideration:

1. A completed, official application form (current year form only);
2. A transcript from any university, college, school or educational program attended within five (5) years immediately preceding the date of the application. The only exception to this criterion, is for SKCR members in good standing, who are pursuing a REALTOR® designation or a leadership training program;
3. A typed, one-page resume highlighting the applicant's academic, leadership, volunteer and community service activities;
4. A typed, one-page essay on the following topic: "Describe your past and present involvement with volunteer and community service activities and how you plan to use the scholarship. Describe how you personally have contributed to the betterment of your community". Scholarship award decisions will be weighted toward demonstrated volunteer and community service activities.
5. Three letters of recommendation from unrelated persons qualified to attest as to the character, reliability, scholarship, academic achievement and any other relevant attributes of the applicant.
